Abdul Basit is a young 17 year old teenager from Diplo, District Tharparkar in Sindh, Pakistan.

He has a hole in his heart and two heart valves are not working properly. He has faced this medical condition since childhood - medical treatment that we would take for granted for our children here.

His father is a tailor and works on very low wages unable to afford the Rs. 1,182,000 (£7,000 / £12,000 / AED 43,670) required to get his son treated. **TO OUR EMERGENCY**

Lack of clean drinking water is a major problem in developing countries. Water-borne diseases are rampant in economically depressed rural areas because clean running water is simply not available.

The only alternative is to install hand pumps or deep wells (drilled wells) to draw clean water from the ground depending on the depth of the water table.

The KGNWT has, with your generous support, provided clean and safe drinking water for those who cannot afford it due to their financial situation. Hundreds of water-holes and hand pumps have been installed in villages throughout Pakistan with thousands of families benefitting.

food support programmes ration packs

> Pakistan has witnessed a dramatic increase in inflation and the severe rise in prices of basic commodities means that low-income families are unable to afford basic foods like milk and bread.

The KGNWT launched the **'Food Support Programme'** in partnership with the Ehsaas Trust and to date we have distributed 28,409 ration packs to over 9,400 families. However, over 10,000 are still awaiting your generous support. With your help, our plan is to expand the ration point outlets nationwide.

mobile kitchens

The KGNWT has also established four mobile kitchens for the poor and those on low incomes serving a nutritional and dignified meal (meat korma and naan) twice a day.

The kitchens (dastarkhuwan) are in:

Civil Hospital, Karachi - serves 1,000 people daily and has served 630,000 since Sept 2012

Pakpatan, Punjab - serves 1,000 people daily and has served 540,000 since Dec 2012

KGNWT Office, Karachi - serves 200 people daily and has served 14,200 since Apr 2014

ARY Office, Karachi - serves 300 people daily and has served 12,300 since May 2014

livelihood projects

Rickshaw, Motorbike & Sewing Machine Assistance Projects

The increase in unemployment has ment that it is getting harder to sustain livelihoods among poorer families.

People don't want charity, they need to be provided with opportunities to get themselves out of the vicious cycle of poverty. The KGNWT have launched two projects, the 'Rickshaw Assistance' project and the 'Sewing Machine Assistance' project to help empower poor jobless people with a means to earn their daily livelihoods and get themselves and their families out of poverty.

The KGNWT has already distributed 56 rickshaws to deserving families. In addition, 26 rickshaws have also been

provided to deserving families on a 'no profit no loss' basis.

Recently, the KGNWT has started another project to distribute 70cc motorbikes to deserving persons on a 'no profit no loss basis'. The trust will distribute 200 bikes among the most deserving applicants and there are already 1,100 more applications in the pipeline!

With your support, we aim to expand all our Assistance Projects to help even more desrving families get themselves out of poverty.

new maternity hospital

The KGNWT is in the process of building a state-of-the-art maternity hospital in Thar, Sindh.

There is poor access to health services in the area and the need is great for such a hospital especially with the maternal mortality rate being 15 times more in developing countires than in developed countries and children without mothers being less likely to receive proper nutrition, health care and education, leading to a continued cycle of poverty and poor health.

The cost of building this hospital is over Rs. 41m (£250,000 / \$420,000 / AED 1.525m)



fatima bai hospital

The Fatima Bai 100-bed general hospital in Karachi is run on a no profit no loss basis.

It is a modern well-equipped and well-staffed facility with experienced doctors and provides affordable treatment for those on low incomes and treats on average over 4,000 patients a month. The Fatima Bai Hospital was established in 1985 under the supervision of the Haji Yaqoob Wali Muhammad Gandhi Foundation.

The hospital has provided the following services to date:

650,000 emergency cases treated 120,000 admissions 45,000 operations (inc. 17,000 eye ops) 50,000 general surgeries 250,000 outpatients given medicine 380,000 outpatients treated for ENT & eye conditions 250,000 children treated 350,000 ladies provded gynae services 200,000 orthopedic outpatients treated 40,000 people treated for dental conditions 80,000 people treated for skin conditions 300,000 laboratory tests conducted 110,000 x-rays taken 120.000 ultrasound examinations carried out 20.000 normal births delivered

matrimonial assistance project

ONE MARRIAGE SPONSORSHIP COSTS RS. 134,000 E8507 \$1,3167 AED 4,834

Due to the rise in poverty in Pakistan, parents cannot afford to get their daughters married with pride and dignity.

The KGNWWT provides marriage funds and with your generous help, to date **Rs. 16m (£114,750 / \$183,600 / AED 657,336)** has been spent on **'Ijtimai Shaadi'** (Collective Wedding Ceremonies) of 156 couples as follows:

131 couples in Umerkot (Hindu & Muslims)
110 couples in Tandoo Bhago (Muslims)
65 couples in Pakpatan Sharif (Muslims)

In addition, the KGNWT has also provided over **Rs. 9m (£54,000 / \$90,000 / AED 334,750)** to families for their own arrangement for their daughter's marriage.

KGNWT has donated over Rs. 12.5m (£75,000 / \$125,000 / AED 465,000) to the Memon Industrial & Technical Institute in Korangi, Karachi, for the construction of a women's vocational wing.

Every year, over 12,000 ladies are trained in different trades which enables them to do work and earn a dignified living, taking themselves and their families out of poverty. In addition, the Ehsaas Trust has also started a vocational tailoring course for ladies at its office. The KGNWT has also donated nearly Rs, 2.3m (£14,000 / \$24,000 / AED 85,500) for the construction of the Madrasa Peer Mahal Toba Tek Singh in Punjab where not only can the local community offer prayers but their children can also get a religious education.

In addition, the KGNWT has donated over Rs. 200,000 (£1,200 / \$2,000 / AED 7,400) to Bahria University & Medical College for educational scholarships and nearly Rs. 3,3m (£20,000 / \$34,000 / AED 122,700) to a number of deserving students for educational purposes.



Families of the Prophet (saw)

Narrated Abu Huraira:

Al-Hasan bin 'Ali took a date from the dates given in charity and put it in his mouth. The Prophet (saw) said, "Expel it from your mouth. Don't you know that we do not eat a thing which is given in charity?" (BUKHARI AND MUSLIM)

There are thousands of members of the Prophet's (saw) family who are living below the poverty line but do not ask for charitable handouts.

Giving and receiving gifts is an important part of the Islamic teaching as love for one's fellow man is a foundation of the faith. The Prophet (saw) gave and received gifts throughout his blessed life and instructed thus:

"Give gifts and you shall love one another" (BUKHARI)

Show your love for the Prophet's (saw) family and give them a gift today.

PLEASE GIVE A FAMILY A GIFT TODAY FROM AS LITTLE AS RS. 12,665 (£75 / \$121 / AED 468)

Ramadan reminders*

Zakat-ul-Fitr: Rs. 800 / person (£5 / \$8 / AED 29)

Obligatory for every person to pay before Eid prayer.

Fidyah: Rs. 23,900 / month (£150 / \$234 / AED 862)

Payable for a person who has become extremely weak due to old age or disease and cannot fast.

Kaffarah: Rs. 47,800 / month (£300 / \$468 / AED 1,724)

Payable for a person who has broken a fast in Ramadan without a valid reason and they are unable to fast for 2 months continuously with no break in between.

Qurbani reminders*

Ourbani means sacrifice. The significance of the sacrifice is from the offering of Prophet Ibrahim (as), who was prepared to sacrifice his son Ismail (as) to Allah (swt), upon having a dream of such a command. He prepared to offer his son, but this was a test from Allah (swt), so before he could slaughter his son, the angels replaced him with a sacrificial animal. To remember this, those who can afford to, undertake a sacrifice.

Since 2010, over 86,000kg of meat has been distributed to over 16,000 deserving families.
